

May issue of QST magazine which again shows my expiration as 6/2025. I haven't had time to call the ARRL again but it sure seems wasteful for them to send renewal notices to members with two years to go on their membership.

Speaking of the ARRL, if you join or renew the ARRL through LEARA, the association receives \$5 for each application or renewal we process. Directions for doing so are in the gray box on page 2.

Ohio's New No Cell Phone Law: From the Ohio Department of Transportation's web site (https://www.transportation.ohio.gov/

phonesdown): As of April 4, 2023, it is illegal to use or hold a cell phone or electronic device in your hand, lap, or other parts of the body while driving on Ohio roads. If an officer sees a violation, they can pull you over.

Drivers over 18 years old can make or receive calls via hands-free devices, including: speakerphone, earpiece, wireless headset, electronic watch, or connecting the phone to the vehicle. In most cases, anything more than a single touch or swipe is against the law. If you must physically manipulate your device, you should pull over to a safe location and park your car before handling.

Drivers can listen to audio streaming apps and use navigational equipment if they turn them on before getting on the road or use a single touch or swipe to activate, modify, or deactivate them. Drivers under the age of 18 are still restricted from using their devices in any way, including hands-free features.

There are many exceptions included in the new law. Perhaps most important for readers of this column is a specific exemption for licensed operators using an amateur radio. Other exemptions include:

- Drivers reporting an emergency to proper authorities.
- Drivers holding a phone to their ear only during phone conversations, if the call is started

or stopped with a single touch or swipe.

- Drivers holding or using cell phones and other electronic devices while stopped at a traffic light or parked on a road or highway during an emergency or road closure.
- First responders (law enforcement, fire, EMS), using electronic devices as part of their official duties.
- Utility workers operating utility vehicles in certain emergency or outage situations.
- Commercial truck drivers using a mobile data terminal.

This new law is a primary law, meaning if an officer sees a violation they can pull you over for it. They do not need another violation to stop you for this. For the first six months law enforcement will issue warnings for violation of the new law. Beginning October 5, 2023 police will begin issuing citations. Penalties for a first offense include up to a \$150 fine and two points on your driver's license. Subsequent offenses within two years have increased fines and points assessed, all the way up to a \$500 fine and possible 90 day suspension of driver's license.

Remember, regardless of which electronic device you use or how you use it, paying attention to driving must always be your first priority. Be especially careful when driving in heavy traffic or inclement weather. Put the microphone or other device down and get to your destination safely.

Until next month, talk on the radio and use the repeaters. Check into one of the many nets available on the LEARA repeaters. Join us on the air, online, or in person. If you don't feel safe meeting in person, we understand. But, we really want to see or at least hear from you, even if it is only by radio or Zoom.

Amateur Radio Included in FEMA Guide for National Emergency Preparedness

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has released a final version (March 2023) of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Functional Guidance. The guidance, which provides a framework for communications resources within incident management, officially includes support from amateur radio operators. The expanded Communications Unit (COMU) structure now includes the Auxiliary Communicator (AUXC) role, which covers personnel from services that provide communications support to emergency management, public safety, and other government agencies. This includes amateur radio.

NIMS guides government, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector to work together to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters and other emergencies. "This is a

major step in the recognition of the need and usefulness of amateur radio and other communications services in our national preparedness," said Josh Johnston, KE5MHV, Director of Emergency Management for ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio®. "It also gives official guidance to pave the way for future training and education of volunteers in ARRL's Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®)," Johnston added.
