

Off-Topic: Sara and I don't go to see very many movies but a couple of weekends ago we did go see "Reagan". As people of an age that we lived through much of the time period depicted, we found the history to be very accurate, at least as accurate as one could expect from a movie that compresses 70 years into 2 hours 15 minutes. The reaction of the audience was amazing. After we saw the movie, I stumbled on a web page of movie reviews. The professional reviewers gave "Reagan" an 18% positive rating while people who were polled leaving the theatres gave it a 98% positive rating. We really enjoyed it and recommend catching it while it is still in theatres.

River Run 2024 Experience: Despite our best intentions to get out and participate in more public service this year, that really didn't happen. But Sara and I did make it out to River Run. This is a fun event that involves walkers and runners in a half marathon starting in the area of Wallace Lake and traveling north through the Rocky River Reservation of the MetroPark to the Memorial Fields ball diamonds near the north end of the park. Hams are positioned along the route to help with traffic control, be extra eyes for the welfare of the participants, and report shortages at water stops. Hams also track the first and last runners along the course, report unauthorized vehicles on the course, and provide SAG support.

This year we were stationed at the bottom of Stinchcomb hill to prevent unauthorized cars from entering the course. I got to try out some new blinky lights on my car and found a problem with some old ones. The old ones are Whelen dash strobes (real strobe bulbs, not LEDs) that I've never run for more than a few minutes at a time. It turns out that after half an hour they get pretty warm and one got to the "smells like overheated electronics and hot plastic" stage. However, I have a newer Whelen LED light that I swapped in. And, the new mini roof LED light bar that I recently bought at a sale price on Amazon exceeded expectations.

Not only does the public service event give us an opportunity to use our hobby, it provides us an opportunity to test and exercise our equipment and gain experience in preparation for real SHTF emergencies.

The 50th Annual Cleveland Hamfest & Computer Show is Sunday, September 22, **2024** at the Cuyahoga County Fairgrounds, 164 Eastland Rd., Berea, OH 44017 from 8:00 A.M. to 12 Noon. This was the very first hamfest I ever attended. That was in the late 1980s and before I was licensed. Now, I've been to Dayton and Mansfield and a handful of others. Admittedly there is no way it can compete with Dayton, but I find it to be a good size. It is big enough to draw a wide range of vendors from a large area and yet small enough to see most of it in half a day. The Cleveland Hamfest remains my personal favorite. As time goes on, I find that I need less stuff, but enjoy the face QSOs with acquaintances infrequently seen. I hope to see you there.

Foxhunting: The Northern Ohio Amateur Radio Society (NOARS) has been running monthly hidden transmitter hunts in the MetroParks and western suburbs. National Preparedness Month: Have a Go Kit

September is National Preparedness Month, and ARRL is working to help radio amateurs have a plan for family resilience. Many hams enjoy public service as part of their operating. Being ready to activate for a served agency through the ARRL Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®) involves not only being licensed and trained, but also prepared and equipped.

ARRL Director of Emergency Management Josh Johnston, KE5MHV, suggests that hams and their families have a "go-bag". He says there are a few things to consider: "You need to be able to function while activated, so that means you need a kit for your needs and a kit for your radio needs. If your family is impacted by the situation, they also need to have some gear at the ready."

On the ARRL website, there's an Emergency Prep Kit Checklist. It lists the common items such as food and water for several days, a first aid kit, medications, chargers for your devices and other useful items.

Having a kit for your radio is useful as well. "Go kits will vary based on function and need for the field," said Johnston. "Most kits should include a dual band HT and/or mobile radio with antenna,

a power supply and all necessary cables and connectors. Every kit should include note pad or paper of some type as well as pens or pencils. You should have a power source and power cables. If you are working HF then you will need an HF radio and antenna, and if you want digital capabilities, then a computer with software preloaded will be desired."

Other things you may want will include tape and tools, spare batteries, headphones, flashlights of some sort, cell phone chargers, and a multimeter. Other items that won't fit in a bag but may be needed include a generator, a working surface like a small folding table, a chair, and some type of shelter.
